

**ConocoPhillips and

Clubs Announce
\$100,000 Grant to Fund Learning
Center at New Ferndale Clubhouse**

ConocoPhillips and the Boys & Girls Clubs of Whatcom County today announced a \$100,000 contribution from ConocoPhillips to the Club's current capital campaign to rebuild the Ferndale facility, which was destroyed by fire on January 1, 2007.

The ConocoPhillips donation is designated for construction of a learning center at the new Ferndale Clubhouse. Construction on Ferndale's new 18,500 square foot facility is expected to begin in August of 2008, with completion slated for fourth quarter 2009.

The new Club will be located in Ferndale's Pioneer Park, between 1st and 2nd Avenues. With athletic fields, a teen center, a kitchen, a computer room, a gymnasium, and an arts room to go along with the ConocoPhillips Learning center, the new facility is expected to serve more than 2,000 members a year. The new clubhouse will also be the site of numerous community events.

"This is an important investment in the youth of Whatcom County and the wellbeing of our local community," said Marjorie Hatter, manager of ConocoPhillips' Ferndale refinery. "The future of our community, including the companies that do business here, is tied to the success of our young people. Boy & Girls Clubs play a vital role in that success, providing our youth with a wide variety of productive after-school programs and activities as well as tutoring and homework assistance. By creating a modern learning center, we hope to enhance the Club's ability to serve the education needs of its members," she added.
